

## Job Description

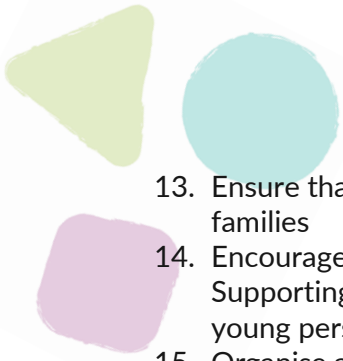
- Job Title:** Play and Activity Assistant
- Responsible to:** Allied Health Professional Lead
- Accountable to:** Director of Care

### Job Purpose:

The post holder will work as part of the multi-disciplinary team and support children, young people and families to engage and participate in play and activity that enhances quality of life. They will provide high quality, holistic therapeutic play for all children, young people and their families across Acorns, enabling them to feel safe and at ease both within the hospice environment and in the community. The post holder will provide appropriate and engaging play and activity that is tailored to the individuals developmental level and encourages participation.

### Main Duties:

1. Use your knowledge of child development theories through the life stages and experience and knowledge of children with complex needs to support open ended play and adapt activities to each individual patient.
2. To be responsible for recognising and escalating any changes in the child's condition during activities, and report to an appropriate member of the team where necessary
3. To empower children and young people to make decisions about their care and to exercise choice.
4. To support children and young people with activities that support and promote independence to their best potential.
5. To help ensure that children and young people are introduced and encouraged to engage in a wide range of stimulating and creative activities by interaction and play in all environments, encouraging the use of local community facilities where appropriate.
6. To promote communication with the children and young people, encouraging them to express their wishes and concerns to their best ability (this will include non-verbal, electronic or alternative communication methods).
7. To ensure that the child's or young person's psychological and social needs are met as well as their physical care, and participate in the development of the service, reinforcing Acorns values.
8. To provide a stimulating environment to enhance the lifestyle of the children and their individuality and promote / integrate activities that are age and developmentally appropriate and culturally normative day to day, considering individual health needs.
9. To deliver child-focused, family-centred palliative and end of life care, alongside other members of the interdisciplinary team.
10. To organise and facilitate opportunities to play for individuals and groups of children and young people in all settings.
11. To play a key role in early intervention and engagement with Acorn's services through play and activity opportunities.
12. Plan for uncertainty and adapt play sessions to meet the needs of the child or young person, be flexible in your approach and seek guidance where necessary.

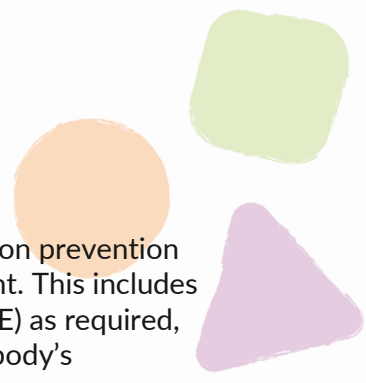
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13. Ensure that a caring and safe play environment for children / young people and their families
  14. Encourage and support families to engage in play with their child / young person. Supporting them to feel comfortable in understanding safe play based on the child or young person's condition.
  15. Organise and support family splash, play and group activities within the hydrotherapy pool
  16. Work as part of the wider therapies team to promote activity and participation to children and young people with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions.
  17. Support Allied Health Professionals team to deliver treatment sessions by working together to provide engaging play and activity that supports achievement of their goals.
  18. To support memory making for families, including at end of life where appropriate
  19. Provide health education information to the child and family, to promote a healthy lifestyle and where appropriate address public health issues
  20. Identify and utilise appropriate outcome measure to evidence best practice and develop service standards


## Wider Responsibilities

1. Always remaining professional, acting as a role model to other team members whilst maintaining professional boundaries.
2. To attend regularly and contribute to team meetings and clinical/safeguarding supervision to ensure effective communication and shared learning is maintained.
3. Participate in research and audit relevant to development and delivery of the service.
4. To report incidents, near misses and potential complaints in line with Acorns policy and procedures.
5. Maintain standards and ensure clinical governance is central to the function of the service.
6. Maintain clear and contemporaneous paper and electronic records in line with Acorns Policy
7. Engage in continuous professional development and completion of annual appraisals, fulfilling own responsibility for appraisal process and agreed personal development/training plan.
8. To be an active member of the multi-disciplinary team supporting the child, young person and their family, and promote and contribute to effective team working.
9. Seek support if decisions or questions are outside of knowledge based to ensure safe but effective play.
10. Ensure that activity and outcome data is maintained in accordance with Acorns procedures and guidelines.
11. Be actively involved in networking with relevant special interest groups.

## Infection Prevention and Control

All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns will be expected to follow all infection prevention and control policies and procedures to ensure a safe and healthy environment. This includes maintaining best hygiene practices, using personal protective equipment (PPE) as required, and adhering to safety protocols to minimise the risk of infection. It is everybody's





responsibility to promote a clean and safe environment for staff, children, young people, and their families.

### Health and Safety

All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns are required to comply with all health and safety policies and procedures in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974. This includes taking reasonable care of their own health and safety, as well as that of others who may be affected by their actions. The role involves using personal protective equipment (PPE) when necessary, following established safety protocols, reporting hazards or unsafe conditions, and participating in health and safety training. All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns must actively contribute to maintaining a safe and healthy environment and cooperate with the employer to ensure compliance with relevant health and safety legislation.

### Environmental sustainability

All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns are required to support minimising environmental impact wherever possible, including recycling, switching off lights, computers, monitors and equipment when not in use. Helping to reduce paper waste by minimising printing/copying and reducing water usage, reporting faults and heating/cooling concerns promptly and minimising travel. Where the role includes the ordering and use of supplies or equipment, the post holder will consider the environmental impact of purchases.

### Safeguarding

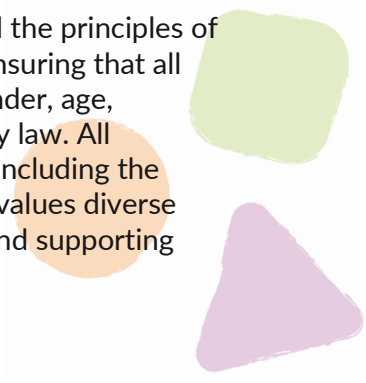
Acorns is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. It is the responsibility of all staff to always safeguard and protect children and adults at risk, staff must report any concerns as per safeguarding policies and procedures which are available on Acorns internal systems. Every staff member must undertake regular mandatory safeguarding training at a level relevant to their role.

### Data Protection and Confidentiality

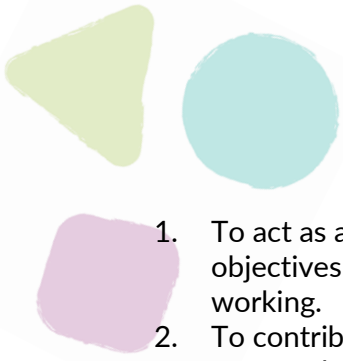
All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns are required to comply with all relevant data protection laws, including the Data Protection Act 2018 and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). This includes ensuring the confidentiality, integrity, and security of personal and sensitive information. All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns must handle all data in accordance with organisational policies and procedures, ensuring it is only used for its intended purpose and is not disclosed to unauthorised individuals. The role may involve safeguarding personal data, reporting any data breaches, and always maintaining strict confidentiality to protect both individuals' privacy and the organisation's legal obligations.

### Equality, Inclusivity and Diversity

All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns are required to promote and uphold the principles of equality, inclusivity, and diversity in all aspects of their work. All Employees and Volunteers of Acorns must comply with relevant legislation, including the Equality Act 2010, and contribute to creating an inclusive environment that values diverse perspectives. The role involves actively challenging discrimination and bias and supporting the organisation's commitment to providing equal opportunities for all.



### Other Duties:

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1. To act as an ambassador for Acorns raising awareness of its charitable aims and objectives and enhancing its reputation through exemplary behaviour, conduct and team working.
  2. To contribute to Acorn's fundraising aims by raising awareness with your stakeholder groups about how vital fundraising is to the charity's mission and sharing opportunities for fundraising support
  3. To put the needs and interests of Acorns children and young people and their families first in all aspects of their work.
  4. To ensure compliance with Acorn's policies for diversity, employment, equal opportunities, health and safety, information governance, and safeguarding.
  5. To actively participate in an annual performance and development review process and any training and development identified to further enhance your role with Acorns.
  6. Promote a coaching culture within Acorns and provide coaching expertise as a resource across the organisation.
  7. To carry out any other reasonable duty as requested by your line manager.
